74.01(1)(b.2)	<p>Misrepresentations to public</p> <p>A person engages in reviewable conduct who, for the purpose of promoting, directly or indirectly, the supply or use of a product or for the purpose of promoting, directly or indirectly, any business interest, by any means whatever ... (b.2) makes a representation to the public with respect to the benefits of a business or business activity for protecting or restoring the environment or mitigating the environmental and ecological causes or effects of climate change that is not based on adequate and proper substantiation in accordance with internationally recognized methodology, the proof of which lies on the person making the representation;</p>	<p>Misrepresentations to public</p> <p>A person engages in reviewable conduct who, for the purpose of promoting, directly or indirectly, the supply or use of a product or for the purpose of promoting, directly or indirectly, any business interest, by any means whatever ... 103.1(6.2)	[No limitation prescribed under Bill C-59.]	<p>Refusing leave — section 74.1</p> <p>However, the Tribunal is not to consider an application for leave in respect of an application under section 74.1 that is made on the basis of paragraph 74.01(1)(b.2).</p>
